From the very first beginnings of our Parish, when small numbers of people gathered for Mass in a stable (on ground now occupied by Tesco's, opposite the train station); we have grown, year on year, as a beacon of Christ's Light to be the wonderful gathering of individuals and families we are today, 175 years



after the first light of our Parish dawned. We have been blessed to have had the help of many priests and people over the years, and are extremely grateful to the legacy they have left us.

To build on that legacy, Fr Adrian would like to introduce a series of House Masses on a Saturday evening, where small groups of neighbouring Parish Family members and friends take turns in hosting Mass in a simple gathering in their home, ending with a bring-and-share meal afterwards. It is hoped, that by gradually coming together as small-group communities, each little gathering for a Saturday evening Mass will be an extra Beacon of Christ's Light in our neighbourhood, with the chance of family and friends to encounter the light of Christ through the warmth, welcome and witness such small gatherings offer. **We don't have the capacity to offer Mass each week on a Saturday or Sunday evening in the Parish Church, but it is hoped that by getting to know each other through small-group House Masses, our Parish will continue to grow and thrive for many more years to come. Our newsletter was a "Bumper Edition" for the summer, with information for the whole of August since the Parish Office is closed during this time. Any changes to the Mass Intentions will be posted weekly in the church noticeboard, which is found to the right of the main door.

On Sunday 1st September we will have our next opportunity of giving a donation to our Parish "Building Together" collection which helps to meet some the costs of the Health and Safety work which is needed to maintain our beautiful church.

Saturday 7th September sees the Church's 157th Anniversary since our Consecration (when the Church was blessed once it was debt-free) **and 175 years since we formally began life as a Mission in 1849.** That weekend also sees Fr Adrian 'coming of age' as he celebrates 30 years of being part of the Diocese and 21 years as an Ordained Priest. **Please come and celebrate these anniversaries as well as the start of the new term and the formal start to our Sacramental Programmes by joining Fr Adrian in the Parish Hall for our second Pizza night of the year! This isn't a party for you to bring along gifts, but do please bring along drinks and pizza that you'd enjoy.** Fr Adrian can cook your pizza so that you can eat and drink with family and friends or bring some pizza that you'd be happy to share by 'mixing and matching' with other types of pizza brought along by others. **If you forget, then Fr Adrian will have a few blank pizza bases to cook with a choice of toppings such as mushrooms, basil, mozzarella and olives but if you'd like a Hawaiian then you'll need to bring your own pizza 😊**

Catholic Nursery/Reception, Secondary School Transfers and 6th Form Applications for 2025

If you're applying to a Catholic School for next year, please see Fr Adrian after Mass to obtain a form called the **Parish Reference Request**". This form, with a family photo and a COPY of the child's baptism certificate, together with any school forms for Fr Adrian to complete (the school SIF if you already have them) are to be handed back to Fr Adrian at the end of the usual Sunday Mass you attend. Please do not delay returning the Parish form until you have all the school forms, as Fr Adrian needs time to collate the information. Please make sure you are aware of each School's cut-off date, e.g., Secondary Schools will need their completed forms over the next few weeks. Please remember that at least a week is needed to give time to process the forms so that forms handed in one Sunday are usually returned the next week. Please see Fr Adrian if you have any questions

Would you like your child to receive First Holy Communion next year? If your child will be in Year 3 from September 2024, whether they are in our Parish School, another Catholic School or in a Non-Catholic School, please see below. In addition, each year we have some children who have not yet been baptised or are from different faith traditions but would like to be welcomed into the Church, so if that applies to you, please let Fr Adrian know so that he can help.
