Fr Adrian celebrates Mass each day for the needs of the Parish Family: see overleaf for details It is important to note that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to remains suspended. Our church is only able to open at set times when there are enough volunteers to clean the church before and after. The church remains closed for repairs Monday to Friday but is open for private prayer from 9.45-10.45am on Sundays. Please note you can just turn up for the Holy Hour and register at the door, but please note that the church has to be empty before the 11am Mass.

22nd - 29th November 2020

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This feast is designed to give special recognition to the dominion Christ our Lord has over all aspects of our lives. In 1925, the Church celebrated a jubilee year in honour of the 1,600th



anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. The Council Fathers taking part in that gathering back in A.D. 325 had affirmed the full divinity of Jesus Christ as God the Son, one in being with God the Father. Their pronouncement became a creed that was later expanded into what we now call the Nicene Creed and is still professed at Mass.

Throughout the anniversary year, Pope Pius XI constantly emphasized the kingship of Christ as declared in the Creed: "His kingdom will have no end." He stressed this theme throughout the year as it repeatedly appeared in the Church's celebrations of the Annunciation, the Epiphany, the Transfiguration and the Ascension.

In 1969, Pope Paul VI took several steps to enhance the witness of the feast day. To emphasize Christ's universal reign, he changed the name of the celebration to the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of All". He also chose the date of the celebration as the last Sunday in the liturgical year prior to new year at Advent, emphasizing even more strongly the connection between Christ's kingship and His 'second advent' ('second-coming') as a merciful judge of the world.

In addition, the pope raised the feast to the highest rank of celebration on the Church calendar, that of a "solemnity." The solemnity was created at a great time of social and political change in the world and today, as we experience the social, political and economic upheaval of a worldwide pandemic, let us pray for the needs of the world now, that we may witness to Christ's rule in our hearts and help to bring God's kingdom of love and peace.

Thank you to all those who have helped our maintenance fund by buying Christmas Cards on sale at £5 for 10 cards with envelopes. There are ten packets of cards left for sale this week during the time the church is open for private prayer from 9.45-10.45am this Sunday.

The cards are available as you come into the church and can be paid for on the contactless donation point.
