Peace Sunday & Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The Catholic Church in England and Wales and other congregations around the country will come together to pray this Sunday for peace. After this we start the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity which is traditionally observed during the octave of St. Peter and St. Paul until 25th January. In recognition of present conflict, this year, prayers for Christian Unity have been prepared by churches in the Middle East, the history of which was, and still is, characterised by conflict and strife, tainted with blood and darkened by injustice and oppression. In response to the Israeli-Palestinian crisis, CAFOD have launched an appeal to support those affected and get funds to local experts in Gaza and southern Israel to aid those who need our help.
