# 3<sup>rd</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> January 2021

Fr Adrian celebrates Mass each day for the needs of the Parish Family: see below for details of our Mass intentions. It is important to note that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to remains suspended.

The church remains is temporarily closed for repairs and lockdown restrictions but plans to open from 10.30am for an 11am Mass on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> January. Up to and beyond that date our Sunday 11am Mass is livestreamed via Zoom.

A message from Fr Adrian, deliberately repeated from last week: "Thank you for the kind words, Christmas cards and gifts that were received over the last few days, they are much appreciated, especially given the fact that, this year, Christmas has been unlike any other. and, like many of us in our Parish Family, I've had to rely on phone and online calls so we can be together 'virtually'. There is no such thing as a virtual family though - we are all in this together and, as we may have faced hardships in life, work or finances, in the past, we still have a new and unknown year ahead of us.

However, it is the reality of our communion together in our own and wider families that can give us strength and draw, most especially, from the strength of our spiritual and physical reception of Holy Communion when that can be possible. This new year heralds the 170<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of our Parish Church and we will soon again, with the work on the safety of the ceiling and the West Window, be able to open our doors again.

I would especially like to thank our Parish Finance and Building Committee who have overseen this work, Clare and Loretta who help to coordinate our rotas and to all those, whether on a rota or not, who support the Parish throughout the year by volunteering in so many ways. Although we've had to work very differently together for most of last year, it will be a blessing to again have the support of our Readers, Extraordinary ministers, sacristy helpers, catechists, musicians and singers, our helpers with Children's Liturgy, our collection takers and counters, flower arrangers, church cleaners, linen cleaners and our altar servers as we establish how we can serve the Lord together having made the church safe again.

### Archbishop John Wilson has written this weekend about the recent challenges of the Pandemic ...

"May I, first of all, wish you every blessing for the New Year and all 2021 will bring in faith, hope, and love. While we still face significant uncertainty because of the Covid 19 pandemic, we take great consolation from the truth that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. In Him we place all our trust. We are now at a point where, across our Archdiocese, the levels of Covid 19 infection have risen significantly, even within the restrictions of Tier 4. A number of priests have tested positive for Covid 19 or have needed to self-isolate. Parishioners, who have served faithfully in recent months as stewards, and who have assisted with sanitising church buildings, have also become ill or needed to self-isolate. Please keep all those affected by the virus in your prayers.

In a few places, the illness or vulnerability of the priest, or of key parishioners involved in stewarding and sanitising, has meant the temporary closure of churches for the celebration of Mass and private prayer. This, of course, is never a decision to be taken lightly. In the situations where this has happened, however, there has been no alternative.

Given all that we face, and for as long as we remain in Tier 4, I would, therefore, suggest that a local determination is made by each parish priest about the Mass schedule for Sundays and weekdays ... Tier 4 allows places of worship to remain open and communal worship to continue. Wherever possible, please enable people to attend Mass and visit the church for prayer, with all necessary stewarding and sanitisation measures in place. If, however, it is not possible to ensure the church buildings are properly stewarded and sanitised, or the risks are deemed too great, or the priest himself becomes unwell or needs to self-isolate, and no alternative provision can be make, please take whatever temporary action is judged necessary ... Yours sincerely in Christ, Most Rev John Wilson, Archbishop of Southwark"

Given this important encouragement we truly hope that we can forge together for **Saturday 9**<sup>th</sup> a team of cleaners and, for Mass on **Sunday 10**<sup>th</sup>, have Stewards and a Reader to enable the church to open safely for Mass. If you are applying for a place at a Catholic Primary School for September 2021 please read this information very carefully as some forms can be sent and completed digitally via email and can avoid the need to print out paper copies. Fr Adrian can complete either digital or paper copies but ALL FAMILIES requesting a reference are asked to email Fr Adrian to obtain a form called the "Parish Reference Request". Whenever possible, Fr Adrian prefers to receive a digital version of the Parish form, photo and baptism certificate sent by email to the Parish Office (details below), but paper copies can be sent as well. Please do not delay returning the Parish form until you have all the school forms, as Fr Adrian needs time to collate the family information and when receiving a school reference, he refers back to the Catholic baptism certificate of the child as well as the biographical data.

<u>Please note</u>: The Parish form is NOT the school reference or Supplementary Information form, but the data Fr Adrian requires in order to provide the reference. Please do not confuse this form with the forms required by schools.

Once completed, PAPER COPIES of school references handed in the weekend before are to be collected from 11.30am to 12pm the following Sunday. This process allows for papers/plastic covers to be quarantined and completed after 48-72 hours, and left for a further 48-72 hours to be collected. Please note: Papers cannot be dropped off or collected outside these times. Under current Tier Restrictions we are able to open for Mass, but not everyone is able to attend Mass, so the collection of any paper copies of school references on Sundays is deliberately outside of Mass. Since our Sunday Obligation continues to be suspended, no one is penalised for not being able to be at Mass on a Sunday as our 11am Zoom Mass continues to be Livestreamed.

Upon receipt of the "Parish Reference Request" Fr Adrian may contact you by phone or Zoom if he has any queries. Please remember it can take a minimum of 7 to 10 days to complete the reference and quarantine process, so please return your forms promptly. Any reference request that is received less than two weekends before the school's final date of receipt cannot be processed as there will not be enough time for the completion and quarantine process. For example, if the Primary School Reference has to be back by Friday 15 January, the last date to drop the form into the Parish Office is Saturday 2 January to allow for a quarantine of 72 hours before and after completion, so that the reference(s) can be collected from Fr Adrian at Noon on Sunday 10 January. Please note: Fr Adrian can only provide references for members of the Parish and cannot provide a reference without a completed "Parish Reference Request" with a copy of the child's baptism certificate attached. Please follow the instructions on the Parish form regarding all the documents Fr Adrian needs, thank you.
