**Support for our Clergy.** Today we are remembering especially all our Priests both sick and retired and how we can help provide care for priests in their old age and

CAFOD and SCIAF have a shared project in Ethiopia and are working together to respond to the food crisis. Years of drought caused by the climate crisis means families are no longer able to cope, but your support means we are working with people right now, providing them with water, emergency food and healthcare.
