When you have signed-up, you'll be part of the "Announcements" Group, where all those who've signed up to the group are based, but then there are sub-groups people can join, such as the First Communion Group, Confirmation, Altar Server Parent Group etc. If you leave a sub-Group then you are still part of the "Announcements" Group but, you leave the WhatsApp Group entirely if

you exit from the "Announcements" section. We look forward to welcoming you to the group and, rest assured, the Parish won't bombard you with messages, we'll just keep you up to date with important news.

This weekend we begin a formal partnership with Share and Care, a community food resource for Sheen, Barnes and Mortlake families in need with children attending six local primary schools, including our own Parish School.

Share and Care had to move out of their old premises so we have welcomed them through free use of our facilities. They currently provide food for over 70 families each week during term time and receive no statuary funding from but have support from local individuals plus donations of food and money through local collections including donations by Marks & Spencer in Barnes, Waitrose in East Sheen and Cavan Bakery in Sheen. Share and Care use any donated monies to supplement food donations where necessary so that they can provide each family with basic supplies once a week during term time. Our Parish supports the work of Share and Care as some of our own families receive donations so if you would like to learn more about the work of Share and Care or might consider helping to volunteer to sort the donations on a Wednesday evening or Thursday before school, please email the Parish Office with Share and Care in the subject heading, outlining in the body of the email your query, thank you.

Save the date: We will be holding a Parish Fair on Sunday 12 May (avoiding the Bank Holiday weekends, the School Fair and Confirmation on 18th May) and ask if you can help at the fair by running a stall. We would like to hold a Parish Raffle with some cash prizes and are looking for individual or business sponsorship.
