In service to God and our neighbours, we foster works that promote the spirit of the Gospel, especially focussing on issues of racial and social justice.



Two Important Dates to be able to Speak-Up for Life ... Dame Diana Johnson MP has put forward an extreme abortion amendment to the Criminal Justice Bill to allow the use of deadly abortion pills send by post to carry out an abortion at home, right up to the time of the baby's birth. The Government confirmed that the Bill would not be debated until after the Easter recess, meaning that, the Bill will be debated after 15th April to allow those concerned to lobby their MP to vote against the amendment.
