Today we celebrate the 'Sunday of the Word of God' a day, instituted by Pope Francis on the Feast of St Jerome in 2019, devoted to the celebration and study of Sacred Scripture and continues our week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Pope Francis says "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." On the 'Sunday of the Word of God' we pray especially in gratitude for those who serve in the Ministry of Reader, a special form of Lay Ministry open to the women and men of our Parish who both live and follow fully the Scripture and Teaching of the Church and have been appointed in their ministry (as with Extraordinary Ministers) after prayerful discernment, training and the approval of the Bishop.

Pope Francis said: "devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world".

Parish WhatsApp Group News

Many Parishioners have formed their own WhatsApp Groups for example our Readers, Extraordinary Ministers, Altar Servers and Music & Singing Group, to name but a few. Most of these have been set-up by individual Parish members, but Fr Adrian has been asked by Parish members to set-up a Parish WhatsApp Group as a whole, with different Groups, such as those named above, being part of the "umbrella" Parish Group which will, like the existing ones, be confidential. A lot of Parishioners use WhatsApp Groups with their neighbours for Street Watch and to keep-up with local news so having a Parish WhatsApp Group is a fantastic idea. Some Parishioners already know that the confidential Parish number (not published in the newsletter) is used as a WhatsApp number so that Parishioners can contact Fr Adrian in an emergency. That telephone number will be used for the new Parish WhatsApp Group but still won't be published in the newsletter so that we know only Parish members who would like to be in the Group can be added. The WhatsApp Group will link the existing Groups under the "umbrella" of the Parish Group, but they will remain self-managed by the existing Group co-ordinators. We hope as many of our 500 Parish families will choose to join the WhatsApp Group but no-one will be added by Fr Adrian or Nicola without their permission as the Parish complies with GDPR and your consent via email is necessary.
