Fr Adrian celebrates Mass each day for the needs of the Parish Family: see below for details
It is important to note that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to remains suspended.

The church remains closed for repairs Monday to Friday but is open for private prayer this Sunday from 10-11am. You can just turn up for the Holy Hour and register at the door, but please note the church has to be empty for Mass.

Unfortunately, following a stay in hospital, Fr Adrian is unable to celebrate a public Mass until next week so, as per our emails on Wednesday and Saturday just gone, please follow links to another Mass online such as that from our Cathedral: www.rcsouthwark.co.uk



As we learnt last week, we symbolize our journey to Christmas through our purple linen: the colour of preparation and penance; the gradual lighting of our Advent candles, the Magi on their journey to Christ and the prayer-lights, prayer-cards and Jesse

Tree symbols on our sanctuary. Over the course of last week we placed the first symbols of our Jesse Tree: a dove reminding us of the peace and harmony of creation as God intended; a fruit representing the original sin of Adam and Eve to remind us that Jesus is the New Adam who wipes away that sin; Noah's ark, reminding us of God's covenant to save his people; a field of stars, showing that we are God's children in fulfilment of his promise to Abraham; a ram, representing the sacrifice Abraham made to God and a link to the ultimate sacrifice of God's own Son; we have Jacob's ladder as a reminder that Heaven and Earth are united in God's care; Joseph's sacks of grain to represent God's provision, even in difficult times and this Sunday we place the burning bush to represent the presence of the Lord and our personal response to how God calls us, even today.

In the light of the recent breakthrough in vaccine development the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales wish to issue a follow up to their statement on 24 September 2020. The development of a vaccine against COVID-19 presents an important breakthrough in protecting others as well as oneself from the virus; a virus which has not only caused a global pandemic and led to a huge loss of life but has also placed a great burden on healthcare workers and systems. Each of us has a duty to protect others from infection with its danger of serious illness, and for some, death. A vaccine is the most effective way to achieve this unless one decides to self-isolate. At present, debate concerns the use of the vaccines developed by Pfizer & BioNTech, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. Some have questioned the use of the Astra Zeneca vaccine since it has been developed from stem cell-lines originating from original cells obtained after an abortion in 1983. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the Pontifical Academy of Life have expressed the view that one may in good conscience and for a grave reason receive a vaccine sourced in this way, provided that there is a sufficient moral distance between the present administration of the vaccine and the original wrongful action. In the COVID-19 pandemic, we judge that this grave reason exists and that one does not sin by receiving the vaccine. Both the Pfizer & BioNTech and Moderna vaccines have a different source since they are not from the 1983 stem cell-line. On 2 December 2020, the Pfizer & BioNTech vaccine was approved for use in the UK. Each Catholic must educate his or her conscience on this matter and decide what to do, also bearing in mind that a vaccine must be safe, effective, and universally available, especially to the poor of the world. Catholics may in good conscience receive any of these vaccines for the good of others and themselves. In good conscience, one may refuse a particular vaccine but continues to have a duty to protect others from infection.
