Many will have the joy of making new memories on Mother's Day as they spend time together as a family, but sadly, for many, this is a day for memories only. Some families are apart through the separation of family life, the distance of travel, or the loss of grief, so to celebrate the memory of all mothers this year, instead of giving a daffodil flower, as has been the tradition over a number of years, we

have made a donation to Marie Curie Cancer care to support their work. This Sunday we invite all mothers in our Parish to receive a Marie Curie daffodil pin, showing our love for our mothers and our care for others. Will all mums please



make sure that you see Fr Adrian as you leave Care and upport through terminal illness church so that you can receive your pin. Mother's Day, or Mothering Sunday as it is properly known, used to be the day when many servants would receive time off to go visit not just their mother's, but their 'Mother Church' as well. It has taken a couple of weeks to figure out the nuances of managing the WhatsApp groups as we first had to create a "Community" but all is sorted now. The easiest way to join is to follow via this link https://chat.whatsapp.com/IrooA4OhO4m1lckAXxgJ4y on your phone or via a QR code ...When you have signed-up, you'll be part of the "Announcements" Group, where all those who've signed up to the group are based, but then there are sub-groups people can join, such as the First Communion Group, Confirmation, Altar Server Parent Group etc. If you leave a sub-Group then you are still part of the "Announcements" Group but, you leave the WhatsApp Group entirely if

you exit from the "Announcements" section. We look forward to welcoming you to the group and, rest assured, the Parish won't bombard you with messages, we'll just keep you up to date with important news.

The Guild of our Lady of Good Council have contacted Fr Adrian to ask if the parish could sponser expectant mothers.
