#### 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent: Mass Book p. 173-176

Prayers for Peace and News for Palm Sunday I don't know where Lent has gone, but I'm probably not the only one who thinks like that! The end of Lent with the start of Holy Week and the joy of Easter will soon be upon us. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, but please note, this week's newsletter gives us the advanced notice that our first Mass will be said at 9.45 am for Palm Sunday. Please note the change of time, as the usual Children's Mass cannot start at 9.30 since we have the Walk of Witness that day. If you can join us for the first Mass with the donkey procession, please meet in front of the church from 9 to 9.15 am. We will leave from the church to walk to the War Memorial in East Sheen where local churches will gather for the start of the combined Palm Sunday Walk of Witness at 9.30 am. From there we will walk back in procession with the donkey to reach the church in time for our first Mass at 10 am. If you can't join the walk, please just wait outside the church for the rest of us to return. Please see the Holy Week and Easter Services sheet which is available from the back of the church. This lists all the details of our Mass times over Holy Week and the Easter period. The donkey is well looked after and its welfare is paramount but, it is used to giving rides. If you would like a donkey-ride, please see the donkey after Mass (see poster)

Please see below: on Tuesday we have a change to our normal weekly Mass schedule. Fr Adrian will be saying Mass on Tuesday (19<sup>th</sup>) to celebrate the Solemnity of St Joseph the spouse of our Blessed Virgin Mary. The church will be closed on Wednesday to allow for the erecting of scaffolding and the inspection of the ceiling before work can begin.
