Changes to the Bible Readings at Mass - New Lectionary Translation from Advent 2024The Lectionary used at Mass contains Bible readings set out over a two or three-year cycle and, as part of the continuing process of updating the liturgy which began in 2011, the Lectionary is changing. These changes have been made to the make the translation from the original languages more faithful to the original and, where appropriate, more inclusive. This means that the Parish needs to purchase a new set of the three Lectionaries used at Mass at a cost of £395 for the three-volume set. Some Parish Families asked Fr Adrian if they could contribute towards the cost and he would like to have a Dedication Page for the front of each volume so that families could either dedicate a single volume to a loved one's memory or have a chosen name included in a list of donors.
